

## **MPS Sports Premium Grant Expenditure 2016/17**

The Government is providing funding of £450 million on improving physical education and sport in primary schools and has provided this funding since 2013.

The funding has been allocated to Primary Schools to 'improve the quality and breadth of Physical Education and Sport Provision, including increasing participation so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of'.

The PE and School Sport Premium is part of a joint strategy supported and funded by the Department for Education, Department of Health and the department for Culture, Media and Sport.

Marlborough Primary School were awarded **£9,355** for the academic year 2016/17.

### **The funding from Sports Premium Grant was allocated in the following ways:**

- Buying into the local authority Competition Package so children can take part in league matches for football and netball and all organised sports festivals during the year
- Buying into a lunchtime sports package from EPIC over three terms
- Employing a member of staff to run after school sports clubs twice a week for KS1 and KS2 children to ensure that clubs are free
- Paying for support staff to accompany children to after school inter-school football and netball matches

## Measuring the impact of SPG spending 2016/17

- Children in KS2 have had the opportunity to take part in weekly after school training and inter school netball and football matches
- All children in KS2 have taken part in competitive sports event held within the LA
- Lunchtime sports clubs were provided for KS2 children once a week
- Weekly after school multi skill sports clubs for KS1 children enabled children to learn a range of skills over a term.

### Feedback from children about the impact of sports on their learning

- I'm more excited to come to school on PE days, because learning feels more fun.
- After PE lessons, I feel more awake and relaxed.
- Being chosen for the football league made me feel proud and thankful.
- I like the warm ups and cool downs, because I feel my muscles stretching and preparing for the lesson.
- I really enjoy the competitive lessons, because I feel so motivated to succeed and win.

### Future plans for 2017/18

- Borough-wide football and netball leagues
- EPIC and CSSA sports festivals
- After school PE clubs including futsal, football and multi-skills
- Playmakers programme
- Chelsea Foundation Play on Ref competition, teacher PE mentoring programme, Digital Blue Innovation Fund project
- Football friendlies with RBKC primary schools
